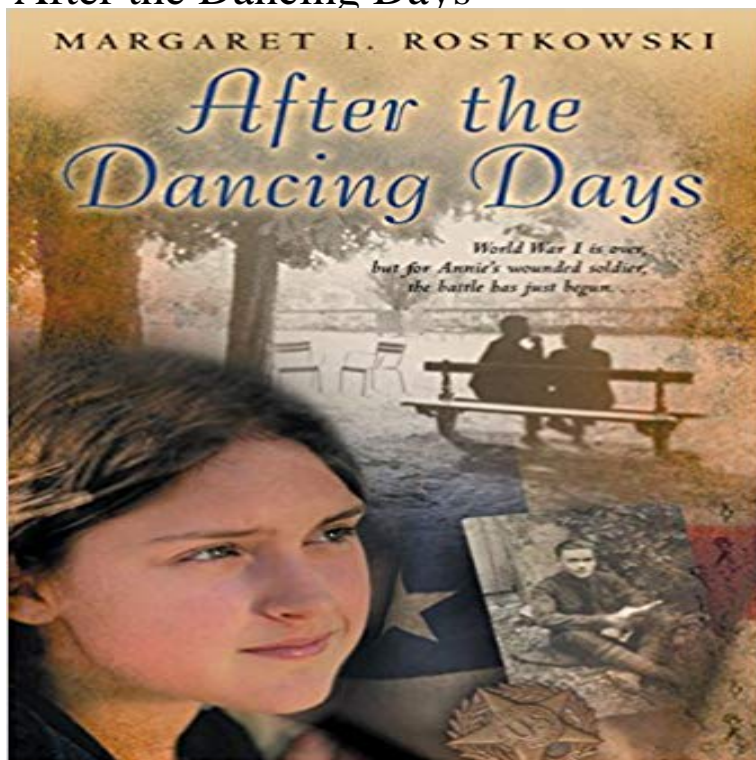


After the Dancing Days
