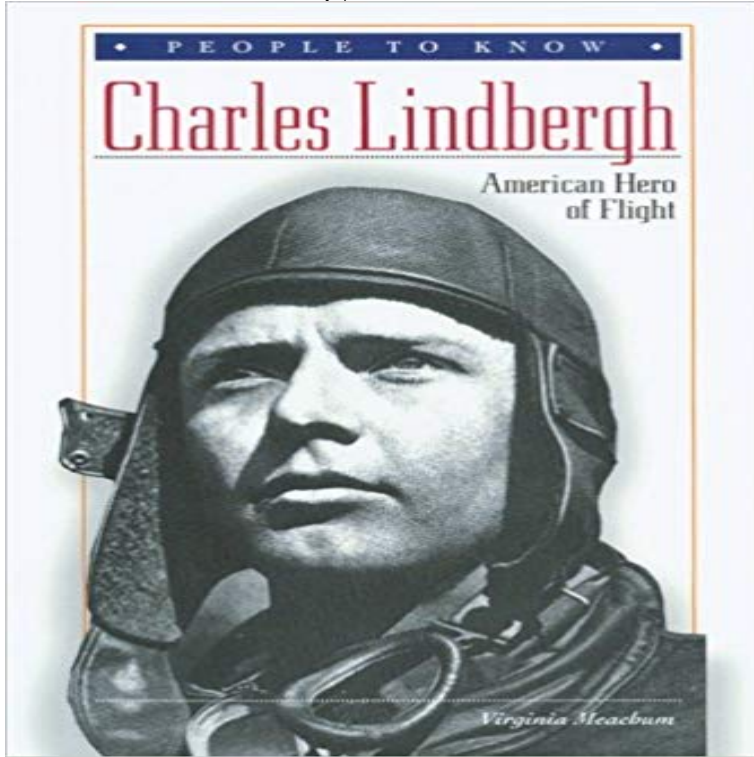


Charles Lindbergh: American Hero of Flight (People to Know)
