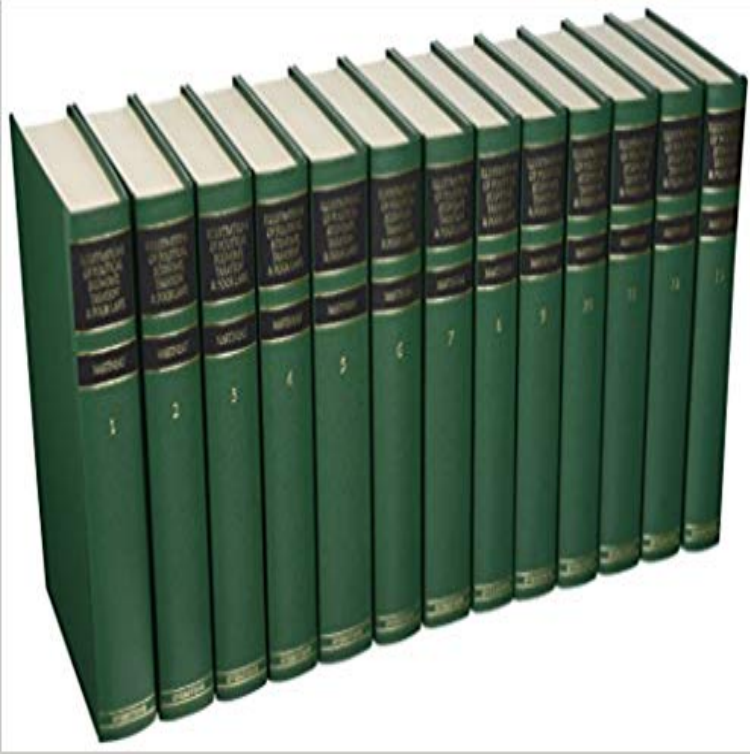


## Illustrations Of Political Economy.

The first twenty-five form *Illustrations of Political Economy*, the great success of which brought Martineau financial success and literary acclaim. At a time when the political economy of Malthus, Ricardo and James Mill was beginning to take effect, there was a great desire to have the science popularized, and this Martineau did brilliantly. Each volume ends with a summary of the principles illustrated and taken together they form an invaluable course in political economics. This work was followed very quickly by two companion works, *Poor Laws and Paupers Illustrated* in five parts and *Illustrations of Taxation* in four parts.
