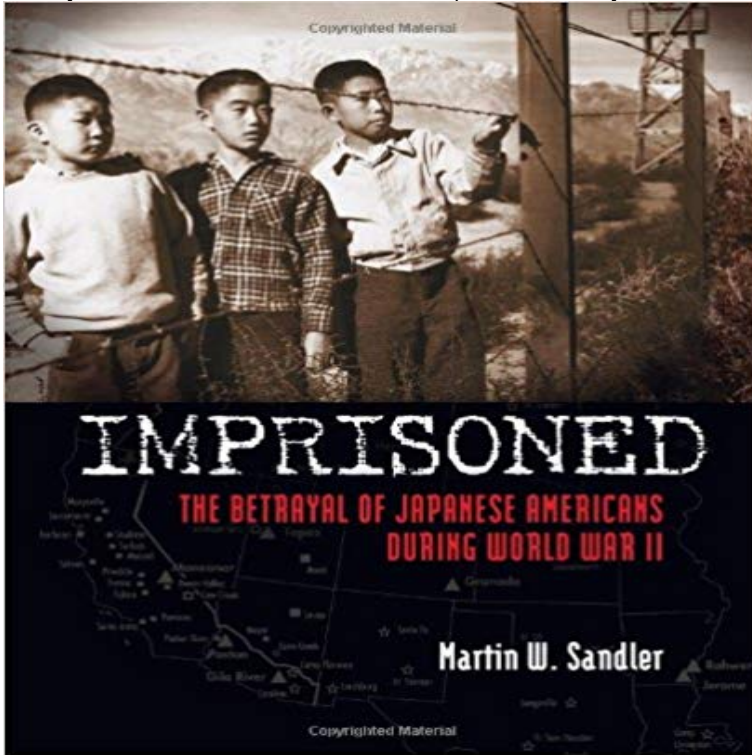


Imprisoned: The Betrayal of Japanese Americans during World War II
