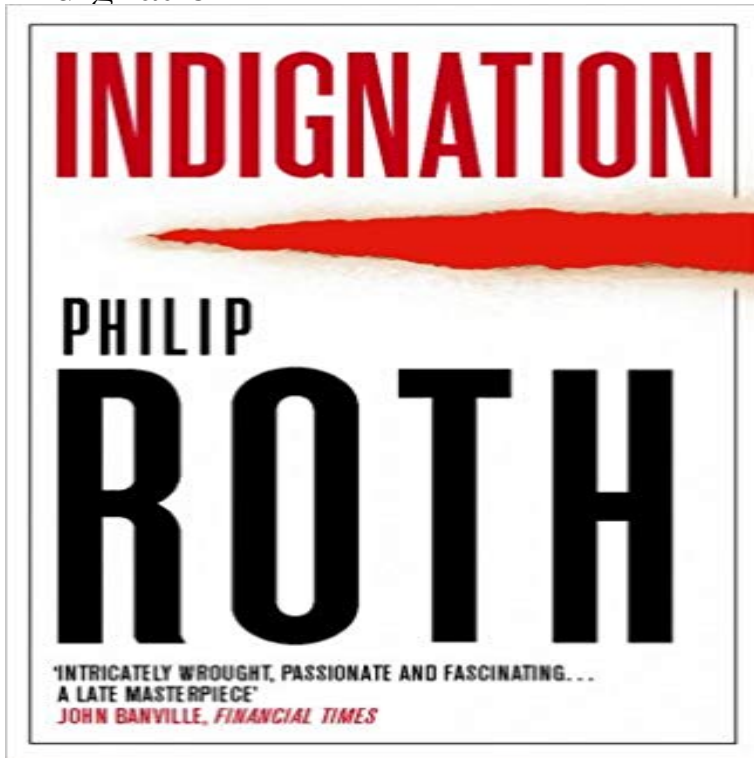


# Indignation
