

Alternative Education Provision at Key Stage 4: LGA Educational Research Programme (LGA research)



In the summer term of 1998, NFER carried out a survey of schools in a sample LEAs, asking them what alternative curriculum programmes they used for some students at key stage 4. Just under a quarter of the schools contacted told us about the schemes they had in place. During autumn term 1998, representatives from 75 of the organisations working with schools were also interviewed about their perspectives on these programmes. These partner organisations included LEAs, LEA support services, youth work, community colleges, other schools, employers, further education colleges, training and enterprise councils, training organisations, and special projects run in particular geographic areas.
