

Johnny Bench (Baseball Hall of Famers)



When Johnny Bench entered the major leagues in 1967, he redefined the way in which people thought about catchers. An amazing catcher, he was also a powerful hitter. He won ten Gold Glove awards for his legendary defense, and hit almost 400 home runs in a sixteen-year career—the most any catcher had ever hit! Bench, who played for the Cincinnati Reds for his entire career (a rarity in modern baseball), was a proud member of the Big Red Machine, one of the strongest teams ever to play the game.
