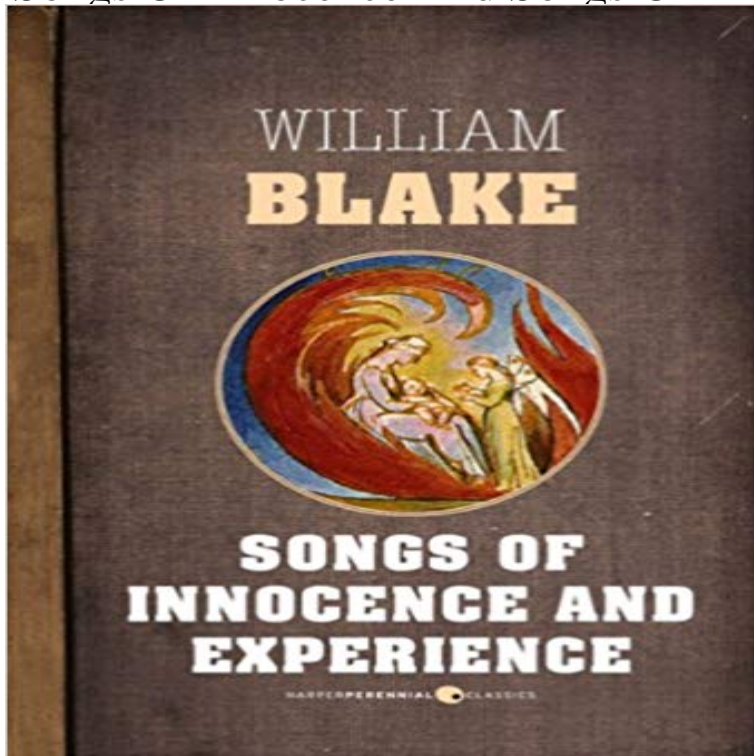


# Songs Of Innocence And Songs Of Experience
