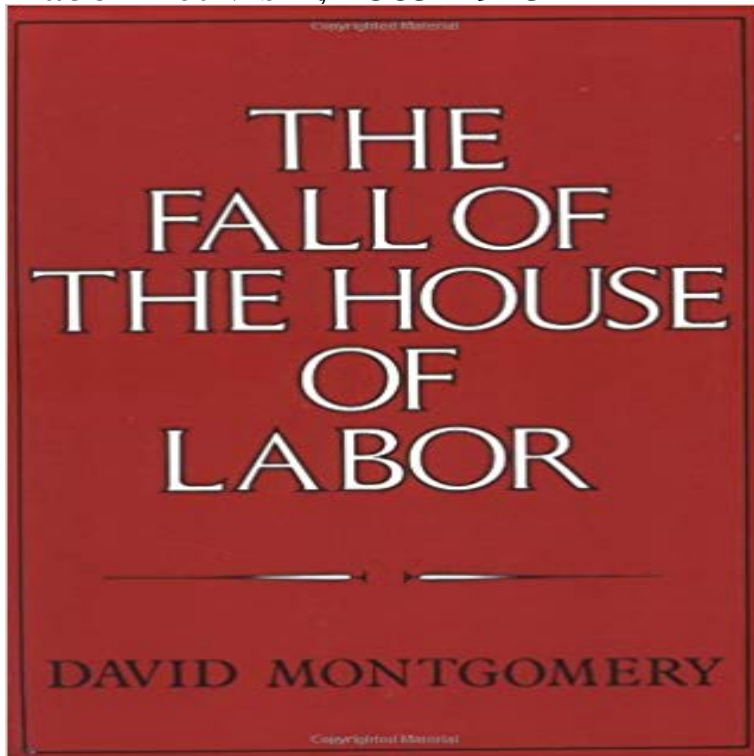


The Fall of the House of Labor: The Workplace, the State, and American Labor Activism, 1865-1925
