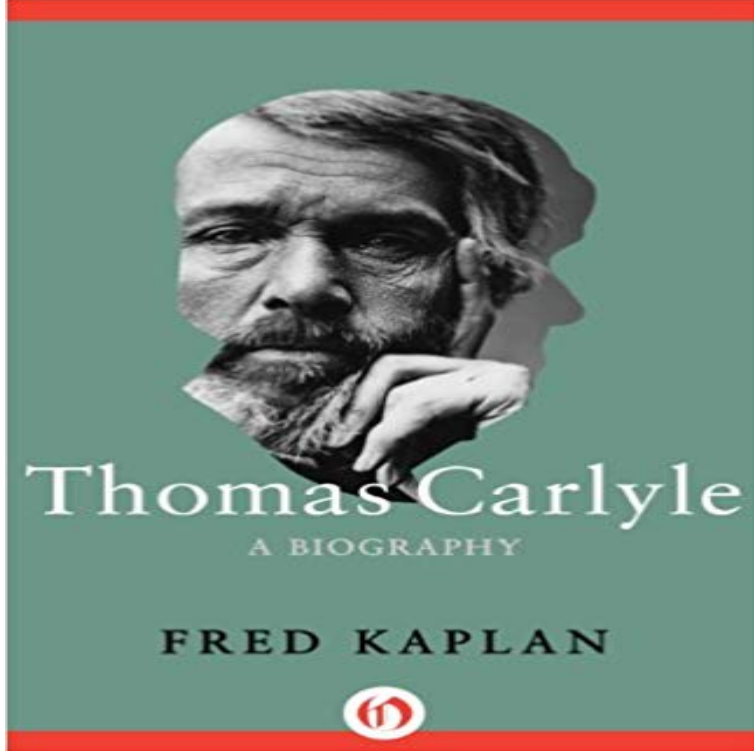


Thomas Carlyle: A Biography
