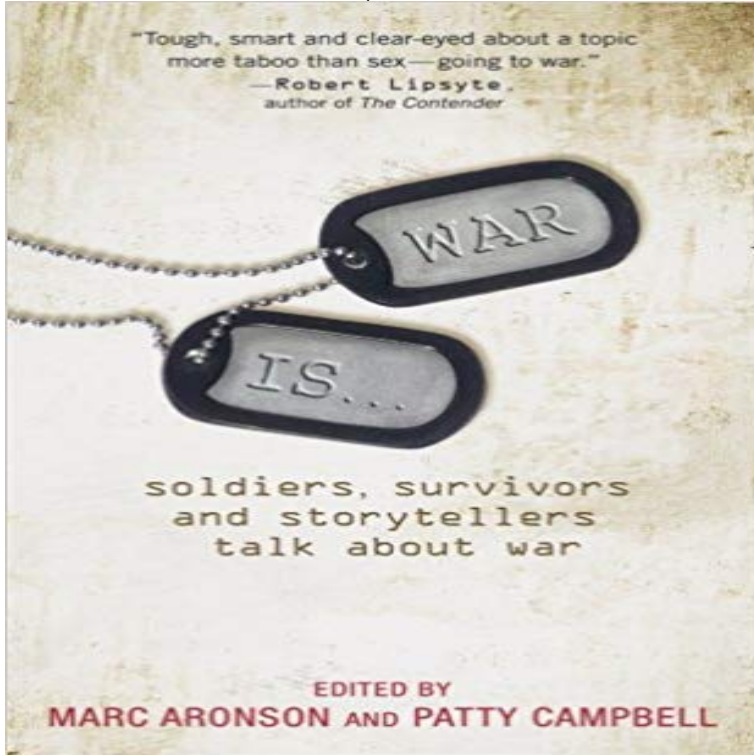


War Is...: Soldiers, Survivors and Storytellers Talk about War
